Caunton Engineering completed the frame for The Curve, the civic building in Slough. As the name suggests the structure was a steel-framed curve rectangle in shape and plan. Each of the buildings elevations featured either cantilevers or sloping and curving facades, with the main north side presenting the most striking aspect with a long sweeping, predominantly glazed, elevation looking on to the adjacent listed St Ethelbert's Church.

The three-storey building was 89.7 metres long, 15.5 metres high and had a width which was 16.5 metres at its maximum and 8.7 metres at its narrowest. With an overall floor space of 4,500m². The centre included a library, café, office space and a 280 seat performance space.
